A message from the Principal

Dear Parents,

Thank you for a wonderful start to the school year!! Your kids came back excited and ready to learn! I love this time of year! Routines have been established and students are busy learning and collaborating with each other. We are also in the middle of Boosterthon and the buzz around the building has been exciting! I can't wait to see the new playground when it is finished! It has been a busy start to the school year as we are learning new literacy program called а Benchmark that has been adopted by the District.

Last year all kindergarten through third grade teachers were required by the state of Colorado to take 45 hours Evidence-Based of Training in teaching reading as a result of Colorado READ Act in SB 19-199. Most of our teachers took a Science of Reading class that was offered by the Colorado Department of Education. According to Benchmark, our new reading program, the science of reading is "a vast, interdisciplinary body of scientifically-based research about reading and issues related to reading and writing. This research has been conducted over the last five decades across the world, and it is derived from thousands of studies conducted in multiple languages. The science of reading has culminated in a preponderance of evidence to inform

how proficient reading and writing develop; why some have difficulty; and how we can most effectively assess and teach and, therefore, improve student outcomes through prevention of and intervention for reading difficulties."

Teachers are working hard learning the new program and implementing what they learned in the Science of Learning class. You may notice that literacy instruction, including reading and writing, looks differently this year than in the past. Your child's classroom teacher will share more information about these changes during our Fall conferences.

I always love to talk about what we are doing at Clear Sky so if you want to stop by and chat about our new Literacy program I would be happy to do that! As always thank you for trusting your children to us. It is not a privilege we take lightly!



We have a lot of great and exciting things in store for P.E. this year!





We are off to a creative start in the art room! The first week of school every student created a mini abstract portrait of themselves to create a fun mural outside the art room. Come check it out when you're in the building!

This month in art :

Kindergarten art students are creating sculptures by manipulating paper strips. They are also creating fun pumpkins out of paper shapes.

1st Graders are learning about the artist Vincent van Gogh and creating their very own "Starry Night" pumpkin patch.

2nd graders are learning about the artist Yayoi Kusama. She is a Japanese artist who is known as the "princess of polka dots". They will be inspired by Kusama's pumpkin art.

3rd graders are learning about the artist Laurel Burch and creating their own folk art dogs or cats inspired by her work.



4th graders are learning about the celebration of Dia de los Muertos. They are creating their own sugar skulls in metal tooling. **5th graders** are learning to weave on a loom.
