

We will have P.E., music, library, health and we are adding science. The science special will focus on the scientific process and hands on experiences. Our hope is to really get our students excited about science. We will also continue to have art and Innovate. Those specials will be for a week at a time and will happen every 5 weeks. 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

As you may have read in the April Newsletter, all K-6 students are working on a Genius Hour/Passion Project. The structure of this project gave your student the opportunity to apply the Design Thinking (LAUNCH) skills they've learned throughout the school year during their time in Innovation Lab. The processes involved with this project promote creative, innovative and critical thinking, while providing kids with the opportunity to learn more about something they are passionate about. Some students have also decided to try and incorporate a component from our learning in the Innovation Lab with their project.



## 2018 Summer Literacy Camps



## Spring Weather

It's that time of year again! These Colorado afternoons can turn into heavy storms. When there is lightning involved, we will have a lightning dismissal. This is only if there is lightning present.

**Please know that we cannot call this type of dismissal until right before school ends.**

This is what you can expect from us when there is a lightning dismissal:

1. A red flag will be hung IF IT IS SAFE on the flagpole to indicate a lightning dismissal
2. A phone call and text message will be sent close to 4:00pm indicating that there will be a lightning dismissal
3. Bus students and Daycare students will wait in the gym until it is safe for them to walk to their buses
4. Walkers and kiss n go students will wait in their classrooms until someone comes to pick them up and signs them out
5. Remaining walkers will be dismissed to walk when it is deemed safe
6. A follow up phone call and text message will be sent indicating when we have released students

We encourage you to sign up for text messaging as it is an effective way to receive information in a timely manner. Below are directions from the district regarding how to set it up:

Parents need to log into Parent Portal and go to their contact preferences. There is a place where they can see the contacts associated with their families. Make sure that Text (SMS) is checked for any phone number/message type that you want to receive texts for.
