Innovation Lab

Welcome back! I hope everyone's first few weeks of school went well and that the 2018-19 school year is off to a great start!

We have hit the ground running here in the Innovation Lab! During their first rotation in the lab, students will be reviewing the LAUNCH Cycle. This is a kid-friendly approach to the Design Thinking process. To help them with this, grade levels will be working with a different "Superhero Challenge".

Kindergarten students are building a prototype of something to help rescue the superheros from atop the world's tallest building.

1st - 3rd Grade students are choosing from six different challenges: water rescue, a single bound, superhero gadget, strongest web, rescue from uptop, and glider back-up. All of the challenges have students building and testing prototypes.

4th Grade students are designing a web that can hold weight.

5th Grade students are designing a prototype of a superhero helmet that must protect a water balloon "head".

6th Grade students are designing and building a superhero city.



This year DCSD Nutrition Services is excited to partner with several local farms and companies to provide a delicious and unique school lunch to our elementary and middle school students.

Our entrée for Colorado Proud Day 2018 is Potato & Cheese Pierogies from the Pierogies Factory in Wheat Ridge, CO. Along with their local restaurant, you may have seen their food truck around Denver Metro events serving up these delicious Polish dumplings.

Our Harvest Bar will feature fresh produce from several local farms. We will have Palisade Peaches from Williams Orchard in Cedaredge, CO. This Western Slope family owned farm has been growing some of the best peaches in Colorado for over 100 years. Our Rocky Ford Watermelon comes from Hirakata Farms in Rocky Ford, CO which is another family farm that has been in Colorado for almost 100 years. Hirakata Farms is dedicated to environmentally sound agriculture practices that can benefit future generations. We will also feature fresh Romaine Lettuce from Petrocco Farms in Brighton, CO. After moving the family farm from Wyoming to Colorado, the farm has grown into a local and nationally renowned business.

My School Bucks

The 2018-19 school year began with a switch to a new payment system district-wide. **My School Bucks** is now for all payments not just school lunch accounts. With such a big change there have been some glitches but the district is reporting that many of the issues have been resolved. Here are a few items that we are seeing at Clear Sky:

- *All CSE field trips will now be entered into My School Bucks which allows us the ability to both pay fees and complete the permission forms online.
- (Note for Families with Free & Reduced Lunch approval: you should see a \$0 fee for all cse field trips. If not, pleae contact susan.babineau@dcsdk12.org to fix)
- *Outstanding past year school fees have migrated to My School Bucks. At this time MSB does not show the school year attached to a specific fee but that should be changed with an update in October.
- *If you don't already have an account go to www.myschoolbucks.com and create one today. After you create your account you will need to add your student(s) and then choose either Lunch or School Store depending on the item you want to see.
- *Optional Recorder/Recorder Book fees for students in Grades $4^{th} 6^{th}$ are now in My School Bucks. If you have a 4^{th} 6^{th} grader who needs a recorder and/or book please go to My School Bucks and choose your student to see this optional fee.

Latest My School Bucks Parent Update from DCSD:

Dear DCSD Parents/Guardians,

Welcome to the 2018-19 school year. We hope the new year is off to a great start for you and your family. As part of the Express Check-In process, Douglas County School District transitioned all required and optional fees over to one payment system, called **MySchoolBucks**. If you previously paid for school lunches, then you are already familiar with this system. If not, a link to a reference guide is below in this document. As we make this transition to **MySchoolBucks**, we have run into a couple of challenges that we want to bring to your attention.

Free and Reduced Lunch Fees

If your student qualifies for Free or Reduced lunch, fees that would normally be waived may appear as a balance due in **MySchoolBucks**. We are currently working to get this resolved. **In the meantime, please ignore any balance due.** These fees will be removed from your account within the coming weeks.

Processing of Partial Payments

Some families have reported that they are unable to make partial payments via **MySchoolBucks**. We are working with the vendor to get this corrected. We hope to have this glitch fixed by the end of August. **We ask that you wait to pay these fees until September**. The same applies to partial refunds, we expect that to be fixed next week and we will process partial credits quickly.

Preschool Fees

There has been some confusion regarding whether or not preschool tuition fees can be paid via MySchoolBucks. At this time, this system is only available to families with students enrolled in grades K-12. If you need to pay preschool-related fees, please contact your preschool directly, or call our preschool information line at 720-433-0025.

Review of Cart at Check-out

It is taking several seconds for the system to add your optional store selections to the cart. If you click the item while it is still processing, there is a chance you will have more than one of the same item in your cart. Please review your cart before making payment so you do not unintentionally pay for something more than once. We are working diligently to fix these issues as quickly as they are identified and apologize for any inconvenience this may have caused. It is our goal to have any glitches corrected by the end of August. If issues are not resolved within that timeframe, we will follow up with additional information.

We do believe that transitioning to **MySchoolBucks** will be a positive change that will make paying student fees much more convenient for our families. Thank you for your feedback and patience as work to make this new system as seamless as possible.

Severe Weather

Severe Weather - Delayed Dismissal

As we all know from living in Colorado, the weather frequently takes a turn for the worse at about 3 p.m.! Clear Sky Elementary will not allow students to leave the building if there is a threat of severe weather. Clear Sky's definition of severe weather is lightning, thunder, torrential rains, notification of a tornado warning or when the district due to inclement conditions closes school early. In the case of severe weather, the following will occur:

- 1. A red flag will be hung IF IT IS SAFE on the flagpole to indicate a lightning dismissal
- 2. A phone call and text message will be sent close to 4:00 indicating that there will be a lightning dismissal
- 3. Bus students and Daycare students will wait in the gym until it is safe for them to walk to their buses
- 4. Walkers and kiss-n-go students will wait in their classrooms until someone comes to pick them up and signs them out. Please notify the school or teacher if someone other than the parent will be signing out your child
- 5. Remaining walkers will be dismissed to walk when it is deemed safe.
- 6. A follow up phone call and text message will be sent indicating when we have released students.

We encourage you to sign up for text messaging as it is an effective way to receive information in a timely manner.
