# A Message from the Principal

Dear Parents,

We have had a great start to the year! It seems like it has been years since we have actually had a winter, and boy are we getting one this year! Many of us were surprised that a late start was not called on Monday. The forecast did not predict that much snow and I think it was a surprise to everyone. I am glad I don't have to make late start/school closure decisions! Please know that you always have the right to keep your kids at home if you feel like the conditions are too dangerous. We want everyone to be safe!

Professional Development is important for our teachers and I appreciate your support while our teachers take these days to learn. On January 18th our teachers spent the day analyzing student writing. We are in the process of adopting a new writing rubric and wanted to use the rubric to score real writing done by our students. Teachers had great conversations and have begun the process of ensuring inter-rater reliability with the rubrics. We are still making tweaks but are planning on using the rubrics next school year and will be able to share them with you at that time.

We have also been spending some of our professional development time doing a book study on <u>Better than Carrots or Sticks</u>. The premise of the book is that positive behavior results are longer lasting and more wide reaching when educators empower students to address and correct misbehavior among themselves.




# A Message from the Principal




# **Apple Awards**

#### **Tech in the Classroom**






# Challenge for the Month of February: Swap Screen time for Physical Activity

Did you know that kids should spend no more than two hours in front of a screen each day? Screen time can be habit-forming: Research shows that the more time children engage with screens, the harder it is for them to turn off the screen as they get older. Plus, screen time has been linked to eating more, having trouble sleeping and poor performance in school. Encourage activity over screen time. Go play outside, go to the MAC or go bowling as a family. Less Screen, Less Screen

This month lets swap screen time for Physical Activity. Start off slow if that's easier by using 15mins less screen time and work your way up. Track your Physical Activity below that you swapped for screen time. Turn this form in by March  $6^{\rm th}$  and the class with the most participation earns the Health Trophy for the month.

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# **Take Action**

Nowadays it seems hard to escape from screens, and kids are especially targeted to participate and spend time in front of screens. Challenge students and families to limit their screen time using these strategies:

#### **Strategies for Home:**

- Make bedrooms "no screen zones". Kids who have TVs in their rooms tend to watch about 1.5 hours more TV per day than those who don't. Move all televisions, computers, tablets, etc. into the family room.
- Designate one or more days per week as "screen-free" days, where physical activity, reading and spending quality time together are prioritized.
- Set firm limits for using screens. For example, no video games on school nights or no electronic devices an hour before bedtime.
- Turn off electronic devices during dinner. Make use of the time together to talk about the day.
- Get active when you do spend time in front of the TV screen. Stretch, practice yoga, walk on a treadmill or lift weights. Challenge everyone to see who can do the most knee bends or leg lifts during commercial breaks.
- Create a TV viewing guide with your children and teach them to schedule out the shows they would like to watch during the week. If you have TiVo or a DVR, record your child's favorite shows and allow him or her to view them at specific times during the week.
- When your children's friends gather at your house, limit the amount of time they play video games. After 20-30
- minutes of playing, suggest that the children move on to something else that does not involve a screen, like playing a board game, starting a game of hide and seek, or playing outside.
- Be a good role model and limit your time in front of a screen to no more than two hours per day, too. If your kids see you following your own rules and being active, then they'll be more likely to follow your example.
- Make it a game! Place activity ideas in a jar. Whenever the family would typically watch a screen, pull an idea out of the jar instead and do it together. Find activity ideas in the **Family Activity Points** Game On Activity.




